According to a statement from PSA (Perdue and Smithfield), in a bid to stymie the outbreak, the company will be voluntarily shuttering their pork processing plants in France, Italy, and Spain, as well as all of their farms in countries that have or are currently under strict lockdown. In their announcement, the company cited the unprecedented conditions in Europe, and how they would be running into trouble as a result of the restrictions. "We recently received updated guidance on our domestic operations that we agreed with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to adjust the approach to our plants. When combined with information from the European Union that some countries have shut down restaurants, schools and other public places, we believe it is necessary to reduce our operations in the European Union." "We know that this step will have an impact on workers and we are very aware of the difficult situation they are currently in. We have a relationship with our workers and are focused on the well-being of those we serve every day. We will closely monitor the situation and work
